



Cargo Flight Arrival from Medan, Indonesia with Household Kits

At 2:00 am on Sunday morning Serge Pun assisted with the clearing and unloading of a cargo plane bringing in household kits from Save the Children, and which landed at Yangon International Airport from Medan, Indonesia.

Each box contained kits of household essentials including plastic sheets; cooking utensils; slippers; and blankets. Other boxes contained hygiene kits including toothpaste, tooth brushes and soap.

Part of this shipment from Save the Children will be taken down to the Delta for distribution in Ngapudaw, Haingyi Island and the devastated villages on Middle Island.

Barracks from SPA's Myanmar Agri-Tech Mawtin Plantation near Pathein

The first flat-pack pre-fabricated barracks building was shipped down to Thingangone and is being erected by our Pun Hlaing Golf Estate Project Management team. This building, which is 8 metres by 18 metres, two storeys with ten rooms per floor, will be completed within three days, and each room can accommodate from two to four persons. We will use this first building for doctors and nurses of the medical team on the top floor, and the lower floor as a hospital. This facility will be used by NGO's including Save the Children, and by Pun Hlaing International Hospital teams.

Five similar buildings will be brought down once the assembly of this building is completed, and these will be erected on Haingyi Island and further up the estuary of the Delta along the western bank of the Pathein River on the opposite bank from Middle Island. These buildings are being erected by staff from SPA Myanmar's MAGT (*Myanmar Agri-Tech*) led by senior project managers from Pun Hlaing Golf Estate.

Mawtin Plantation Estate of a 60 foot long two-storey barracks building identical to the building being erected at Thingangone. All similar buildings at the Mawtin Estate south-west of Pathein survived Cyclone Nargis intact and totally undamaged. Similar barracks buildings are being erected by our Teams in three locations in our area of the Delta to serve as dormitories for doctors and nurses on the upper level, and as hospitals on the lower level.



Robustly built with strong frames and prefabricated insulated paneling, these buildings take three to five days to erect. 60 foot by 26 foot, the upper floor has 10 rooms, each of which can sleep from two to four persons. The lower floor can be partitioned according to the hospital

These 60 foot by 26 foot buildings have an upper floor with 10 sleeping accommodation rooms, each of which can house from two to four persons. The lower floor will be partitioned according to the hospital medical staff's requirements, and used by Pun Hlaing International Hospital staff
